# KCEC Partners with NREL to Create National Model

Recently, the Kit Carson Electric Cooperative team participated in the National Renewable Energy Laboratory's Solar Energy Innovation Network (SEIN). The Symposium was an opportunity for the SEIN program participants to share new solutions, research, and analysis on solar energy adoption. The purpose allowed

participants to share the analytical tools and resources, build further knowledge and skills for organizations to replicate solar energy solutions, and to strengthen the network of stakeholders pursuing solar energy solutions to support implementation efforts across the nation.

The focus of the Symposium was:

- Solar and distributed energy resource (DER) procurement for cities
- Strategic pairing of solar and electric vehicle (EV) charging
- Solar and DERs for system resilience
- Strategic siting and locational value of solar and DERs

Kit Carson shared a tool called, (DG)2 – Distributed Energy on Distribution Grids. (DG)2 is a state-of-the-art planning and operations software that helps electricity distribution system operators and their energy suppliers modernize their grids. With (DG)2 an energy cooperative can integrate solar, energy storage, and other distributed energy resources. The future of software controls are underway.

The other participants in the cohort were the City of San Diego, Montana Renewable Energy Association and Montana Energy Office at the Department of Environmental Quality, City of Orlando, Utah Clean Energy – Salt Lake City, Park City, Moab, Center for Climate Protection, PJM Interconnection and National Association of Regulatory Utility Commissioners, Minnesota – Great Plains Institute, Clean Energy States Alliance – CT, DC, NH, RI, WA, WI.

In October 2019, Kit Carson will release a report, Resilient Renewable Energy Roadmap for Rural Electric Cooperatives, in conjunction with the Innovation Network.

On June 08, 2018, 514 members attended the 2019 Kit Carson Electric Cooperative, Inc. (KCEC) Annual Meeting; which met the required quorum of 489 needed to conduct business. First and foremost, KCEC wants to thank all members who attended the meeting.

KCEC is celebrating its 75th year serving our members, not only with products and services, but enhancing the

quality of life for northern New Mexico communities. The annual meeting was a place for friends, family and members to come together and visit with one another; and most importantly voice their opinions regarding KCEC.

KCEC registered more than the 489 members needed to conduct business. KCEC members acted and approved three by-law amendments. The gym was filled with excitement, cheers and celebration. The three by

laws that were approved:

- 18 year old members shall be eligible to become a Trustee
- Changed the annual meeting date from June to a Saturday in April except if such meeting, for any reason, cannot be held on that day, the date of the meeting shall be set by the Board of Trustees
- District meetings shall be held solely for electing Trustees; no business of the Cooperative shall be conducted at District meetings

During the meeting, KCEC recognized a number of employees that retired this past year, with a combined 147 years of service. KCEC wants to thank Johnny Valerio (44 years), Dennis Gonzales (42 years), David Santistevan (42 years) and Richard Jeantet (17 years) for their commitment and dedication.

KCEC Board President, Bobby Ortega recapped the long history and transformation of the co-op. CEO, Luis Reyes and Christopher Riley, co-founder of Guzman Energy, talked about the 10-year power contract between the two companies. KCEC and Guzman are in the fourth year of their agreement. KCEC is on track with its solar build out with the integration of battery storage.
