Taos County Local Governments, KCEC and EC-Coad Continue to Collaborate on the Wildfire Evacuee Response

The Cooks Peak, Calf Canyon and Hermits Peak fires threaten northern NM. Fire crews continue to fight the fires to mitigate damage to those homes and areas affected. As evacuation levels continue to change, we want to ensure that we share the correct and accurate information on supplies and resources in Taos County. The Wildfires Evacuee Response team encourages evacuees to utilize correct details to get the proper help and supplies.

The Wildfire Evacuee Response has set up the following resources for those displaced by the wildfires in the area. The Taos County Juan I. Gonzales Agricultural Center and Peñasco High School are still available to assist those with shelter and supply needs. More evacuees require shelter and supplies as the fire continues to grow. Water, power, and supplies are available at the shelter sites. Wi-fi is also accessible at some locations. The Taos Rodeo grounds accept RV's and those with livestock. Shelter, supplies, feed and water are available for livestock. For those with RV's not going to the rodeo grounds, please call-in advance to ensure adequate parking is available at other shelter locations.

Once hotels and RV parks run out of space, we encourage evacuees to use our resources for supplies and shelter. We encourage community members and businesses to donate to funds and initiatives already in place. It can be challenging for short-staffed volunteers to sort out donations in a time of crisis. Please consider a monetary donation to your local food shelter or community foundation. We will provide updates and resource information as they become available.
